

YOU CAN RECYCLE...

NOTE: ALL OF THESE ITEMS CAN BE RECYCLED IN THE SAME RECYCLING BIN!

PLASTIC

- 1 POLYETHYLENE TEREPHALATE ETHYLENE**
PETE - Bottles for soft drinks, juice, water, detergent, and cleaner bottles. Also used for cooking and peanut butter jars and frozen ready meal packages.
- 2 HIGH DENSITY POLYETHYLENE**
HDPE - Milk and water jugs, bleach bottles, detergent and shampoo, plastic bags and grocery sacks, motor oil bottles, household cleaners and butter tubs.
- 3 POLYVINYL CHLORIDE**
PVC - Bottles for window cleaner, cooking oils, and detergent bottles, peanut butter jars, water jugs, cling film, and food trays.
- 4 LOW DENSITY POLYETHYLENE**
LPDE - Used for plastic bags, grocery sacks, dry cleaning bags, flexible film packaging, and some bottles.
- 5 POLYPROPYLENE**
PP - Goes into caps, disks, syrup bottles, yogurt tubs, microwaveable meal trays, straws, and film packaging.
- 6 POLYSTYRENE**
PS - Goes into foam meat or fish trays, egg cartons, cutlery, plates, carry-out containers, protective packaging for electronics and toys, and clear trays.
- 7 OTHER**
Includes resins not mentioned above or combinations of plastics.

ALUMINUM AND METAL

All used aluminum and iron beverage containers (UBCs) can be recycled.

GLASS

Glass food and beverage containers are accepted including brown, clear, or green glass.

PAPER

- >Newsprint
- >Old corrugated cardboard
- >Magazines
- >Catalogs
- >Cereal boxes
- >Telephone books
- >Printer/copier paper
- >Mail
- >Empty pizza boxes

All other office paper without wax liners (staples and binder rings can be left in papers and notebooks).

OTHER STUFF

All cups, tops, plastic plates, plastic eating utensils, forks, knives, spoons, and straws are recyclable and may contain small quantities of ice. Please dump out all liquid and remove food debris before recycling.

All clear plastic containers and soup/ice cream containers may be recycled. Please dispose of food in trash before recycling the containers.

YOU CAN'T RECYCLE...

- >Food scraps
- >Batteries, Alkaline
- >Batteries, Dry cell and lead acid
- >Ceramics
- >Glass cookware/bake ware
- >Coat hangers
- >Household items (pots, toasters, etc.)
- >Light bulbs
- >Mirrors
- >Porcelain
- >Windows or auto glass

All materials containing food may not be recycled. Dispose of food in trash before recycling.
